

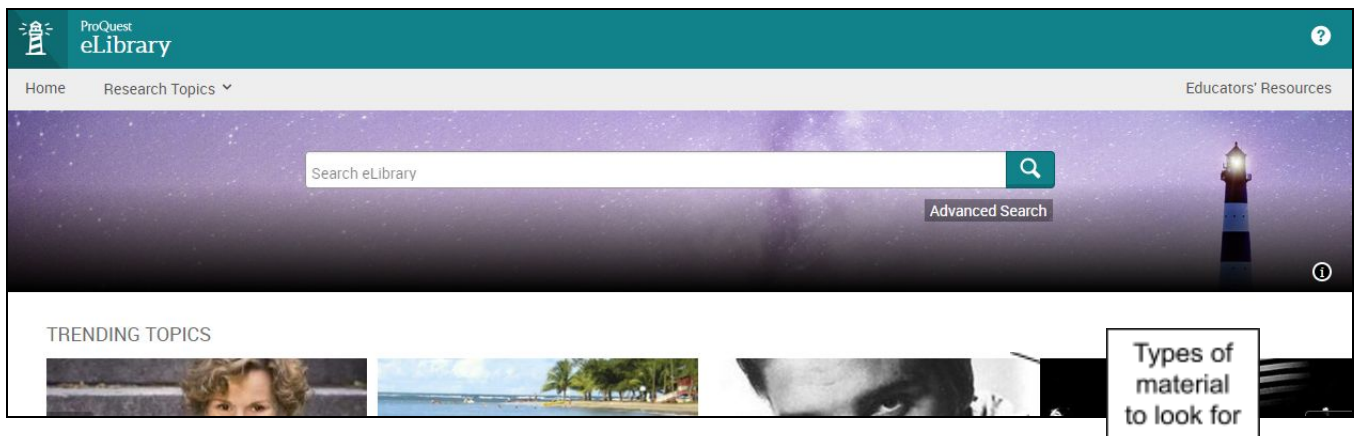
eLibrary

eLibrary is a database that you can search to find the full text of articles from hundreds of popular magazines, academic journals and newspapers, transcripts of radio and TV news shows, and a map and picture file.

How do I get to eLibrary?

1. Start at the Library Connect web site: multcolib.org/libraryconnect
2. Click on either **middle school** or **high school**
3. Scroll down to the Resources section.
4. Click on **eLibrary**.
5. Click on the **Begin using this resource** button.
6. Type in your Library Connect or library card number and password. Occasionally, there may be difficulties loading a database. If you aren't able to get in, go back and try again. If the database still doesn't open, contact the library at multcolib.org/contact.

- Click the Search button.
